In order to deduct expenses as an employee, you must have Form T2200 (Declaration of Conditions of Employment) completed by your employer. In order to claim these expenses, your records must include all of the following:

- A daily record of your expense, together with your receipts, credit card statements, invoices, cancelled cheques, and ticket stubs (for travel)
- A record of each motor vehicle you used for employment; this record must show both the total kilometers you drove and the kilometers you drove for employment purposes in the year
